

**Pewaukee High School Booster Club  
April 7, 2009 Meeting Minutes**

Welcome and call to order 7:06pm

Present were: Christine Baar, John Maltsch, Pat Gallert, Lindy Kanavas, Lori Pjevach, Mary Bacon, Mary Pat Sutter, Sandy Wysocki and Dawn Volgelsang.

Minutes of March 2, 2009 meeting were approved without amendment.

**Concession Guest Speaker:**

John Galobich explained Kwik Trip's pizza program. They provide equipment, including a pizza oven and warmer. Pizzas can be conveniently picked up at any Kwik Trip location, for as low as \$6.50 each. Retail price would be \$2 per good sized slice, with 6 slices in each.

Pizzas can be purchased either frozen or "Take and Bake" Take & Bakes cook in about 10 minutes. Billing is handled monthly through their "data tracker" program. The program also provides a 10% discount. (discount applies to anything purchased from Kwik Trip, not just pizzas). This payment arrangement would be more convenient than what we currently are doing with Rocky's.

Glazed donuts are also a specialty of theirs, and can be purchased for \$.33 each.

Delivery is also available. We would need more information on a few issues, including boxes, and number of ovens we could have, also how large the equipment is vs our available space. We will discuss this further at our next meeting.

**Treasurer's report:**

Pat Gallert reports that: We are in a good cash position. March was a light month for concession revenue. YTD grant totals are \$72,882, including YTD totals for the Fitness Center of \$42,118. The split between athletic and non-athletic is 20%/80%. Overall concession revenue YTD is lower than 2008. Concession grants have not been allocated correctly to Band, Cheer and Poms. We will owe approximately \$2,100; the numbers will be verified. A motion was made, seconded and approved that we will pay these grants out of our available funds.

Motion made, seconded and approved to accept the treasurer's report.

**Athletic Director's Report:**

John Maltsch shared the following information from Joann Sternke. In the 10 year plan, is the possibility for a referendum, as early as this November. A facilities survey will first be sent out to the district to gather opinion on various facility-related projects.

John also reports that:

- Wrestling competed again at the team State meet, for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row, and lost to the State Champions (Ellsworth). Congrats to the Assistant Coaches for the award of "State Assistant Coach of the Year". Head Coach Kurth placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the voting for "State Coach of the Year", and was named "District 7 Coach of the Year."

- Our Regional Champion girl's basketball team finished the season 17-6, losing in the Sectionals to Ripon. Congrats to Amy Slesar for being named "Woodland Conference North Division Player of the Year", being selected for the WBCA All-Star game, and making the US Army Warrior Athlete Team.
- Boy's basketball finished the season 20-4, the second best in school history. They advanced to Sectionals, losing to State Champions Wisconsin Lutheran. Kudos to all Pewaukee fans for being awarded the "Super Sectional Sportsmanship Award"; for the school exhibiting the most exemplary sportsmanship in all seven sectional games played over the three day run! Congrats to Geordin Panagopoulos for being named "Woodland Conference North Division Player of the Year", and being selected for the WBCA All-Star game. Also, congrats to Coach Reuter for being named "Waukesha County Coach of the Year" for the 3<sup>rd</sup> time in his career at PHS.
- Academic Decathlon – Placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in Regional competition, and went on to take 8<sup>th</sup> place in the State.
- Math Team – Recently won the Woodland Conference Math Meet.
- FOFA's "Pewaukee's Got Talent" event last Saturday raised over \$9,000 for the fine art program. Over 300 people attended.
- Track season is underway. Girl's placed 3<sup>rd</sup> and Boys placed 6<sup>th</sup> at the indoor conference track meet. 4 new school records were set by both the boys and the girls. Our Alzheimer Invitational meet is coming up, May 1<sup>st</sup>
- Girl's soccer – Currently undefeated at 1-0-3. The Pirate cup is coming up, May 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, with proceeds going to the LeRoy Butler Foundation in support of women with breast cancer.
- Girl's Softball – is currently 2-0, after Julia Alberti threw a no-hitter on 4/6/09 at Oconomowoc.
- Boy's Golf: just completed tryouts, and begin the season with meets on 4/7 and 4/9 at Nagawaukee.

### **Committee Reports:**

**Concessions:** Dawn Vogelsang, Chairman, reports:

- Spring Lottery has gone out.
- Change for the Spring: the volunteer group running concessions will also be doing the 50/50 raffle, because there are fewer, smaller events. We will resume the usual 50/50 procedures in the Fall.
- Leslie Jost, our Spring Coordinator, is running things very smoothly.
- Booster Club Concession Equipment loans– This previously-discussed topic was revisited. Dawn provided additional information and potential options. Christine Baar provided information gathered from 11 other area schools. Only 1 (KMHS) rents out their equipment. The many pros and cons of equipment loans to non-Booster Club school groups/affiliates were again evaluated. A motion was made, seconded and approved to disallow rentals of BC equipment.

**New Business:**

- Recruitment and continuation for board position/committee chairs for 2009-10 are being worked on.
